Fortress Of The Prince - Performance Notes

"Fortress Of The Prince" is written in 6/4 but should be felt and played with a dotted half note pulse. The players should feel a "dip" on beats 1 and 4 of each measure. When learning the piece conducting in 6 will work well for teaching the basic rhythms, but eventually the piece should be conducted in 2.

At measure 33, the timpani should be muffled with a heavy piece of felt 5 - 6 inches square. Attach the felt to the drum with a piece of yarn or thick string about 6 inches long. This enables the player to throw the muffle on and off the drum easily without worrying about losing it. Also, play this section with the hands a few inches in from the edge of the drum. Experiment for the best possible sound.

The floor tom parts should be played with hard timpani mallets. The jam blocks should sound fine if the mallets are hard, but if not, the jam blocks should be played with the butt end of the mallet.

The Hi Hat/Mounted Tambourine part is written to be played with the tambourine placed to the left of the hi hat.

For the Brake Drum/Ride Cymbal part, play the brake drum with the butt end of a drum stick. This will let the player flip the stick over to play the ride cymbal.


The Concert Bass Drum should be played with (2) timpani mallets, with the drum angled, or layed flat.
